

## CJD Home Care Starter Checklist



SAFETY & SETUP		
	<ul> <li>Clear walkways; remove loose rugs/clutter; add nightlights.</li> <li>Install grab bars and non-slip mats; stage a firm armchair near bed/bath.</li> <li>Teach safe transfers; consider gait belt/walker per PT guidance.</li> </ul>	
DAILY RHYTHM		
	<ul><li>Keep predictable wake/meal/rest times; post a simple visual schedule.</li><li>Limit overstimulation; build in quiet breaks.</li></ul>	
COMMUNICATION		
	<ul><li>One idea at a time; speak slowly; offer choices with yes/no answers.</li><li>Validate feelings; don't argue—redirect gently.</li></ul>	
MEALS & SWALLOWING		
	<ul> <li>Upright seating during meals and 30+ minutes after.</li> <li>Small bites/sips; follow SLP texture/liquid guidance; cue double swallows.</li> <li>Track weight, hydration, coughing with meals—report changes.</li> </ul>	
COMFORT & SKIN		
	<ul> <li>Reposition at least every 2 hours when bed- or chair-bound.</li> <li>Moisturize high-risk areas; keep linens dry and breathable.</li> <li>Create a calming evening routine to support sleep.</li> </ul>	

MEDICATION & COORDINATION		
	<ul> <li>Maintain a one-page med list and symptom log.</li> <li>Share updates with neurology/primary care/hospice; ask about equipment (hospital bed, wheelchair, commode).</li> </ul>
